


## A BRIEF HISTORY OF

Juneteenth is a holiday that commemorates the end of slavery.

Juneteenth is also called Emancipation Day or Freedom Day. On
June 19th, 1865 Major General Gordon Granger and his soldiers
journeyed to Texas to announce the end of slavery. Even though
President Lincoln had announced the end of slavery two years
prior, many opposing forces worked to keep the good news out of
Texas.

## The time after Juneteenth is called the "Scatter"

The "Scatter" refers to how many former enslaved people left Texas to reunite with their families and find better lives up North.
